Our P&C Association

The Kooringal High P&C association meets on the fourth Tuesday of each month during term from February to November.

Meetings are usually held in the staff common room commencing at 7.30pm for about 90 minutes.

Membership is currently \$2 per person.

The Annual General Meeting is held in February each year, followed by a monthly general meeting. Next year, the AGM will be held on **Tuesday**, **28**th **February**, **2012**.

The active and profitable canteen committee is a sub-committee of the P&C and provides funds to the P&C for distribution to school projects.

Grants

Each year, the KHS P&C allocates funds to the school for use in specific areas such as for Presentation Night, the Library, technology, grounds beautification, provision of a shade tent for sporting activities.

Wish Lists

In order to meet additional faculty requests, each semester (twice a year) head teachers are requested to identify areas of need or purchases they would like made to assist the staff and students within each department. The P&C tries to fund all or part of these wish lists each semester by spending the funds donated by the canteen.

Building Fund

In 2009, the P&C established a building fund. The generosity of our school community has already led to over \$8000 in donations. This fund is now directed to providing a new structure providing protection from sun and shelter from the rain outside the canteen area.

Donations over \$2 made to this fund by individuals, families and businesses are tax deductible.

This fund is currently taking donations for the coming financial year.

Canteen Noticeboard

The Kooringal High School canteen is operated by the P&C Association through its canteen sub-committee and as such is not a school-run canteen. Currently, it is the canteen which provides the P&C with additional income to be used within the school to benefit our children. Many of our canteen stalwarts have 'retired' from canteen duty and need to be replaced. There are many days when Gail Chyb, our canteen supervisor has no parental assistance and must rely on senior students to help out. Are you able to help out?? Read on to find out just how easy it can be.

Surprise! Your kids do not like to wait in a queue either? The more helpers we have serving the more sold and the more money able to go to school resources. Approx \$50,000 will be donated from by Canteen via the P&C committee to school resources in 2012.

Did you know??

** YOU are needed!

To operate efficiently the canteen supervisor needs **3 helpers each day** making 15 people each week. Multiply by 40 weeks in a school year that makes 600 helpers required to man our school canteen. Are you able to help out?

** YOU don't have to do it!

All the prepared wraps, foccacias, burgers, rolls and stocking the pie ovens is done before canteen helpers arrive. Just help out servicing and re-stocking the fridges.

** YOU don't have to be early!

For whatever reason, if you can't be there by the time school starts, so what! Arrive in time for recess.

** YOU don't have to stay!

If you have an appointment, haven't finished the washing or need to do something, you can leave between recess and lunch BUT please remember to come back for the lunchtime rush.

** MEN & GRANDPARENTS can do it too!
