



# English

Term 4 has seen a flurry of activity in the English faculty. Students have been working on different tasks in class to show their understanding.

A big focus of term 4 has been on Shakespearean times! Year 8 have been working on very small productions of their own, life and times in the 1600s and have discovered how the Elizabethans insulted people! Some examples follow.

'You rank, boil-brained measle'!

'You churlish, beetle-headed lout'!

'You beslubbering, folly-fallen harpy'!

Students in Year 8 have also adapted the classic Shakespearean tragedy of Romeo and Juliet to cartoon form! One inspired young artist even retold the story of Romeo and Juliet ... as donuts! Here are some wonderful examples:

# Support Unit

On Wednesday 13th November 2019 students from the KHS Support Unit travelled to Jubilee Park for the IO/IS Athletics Carnival.

Students with disabilities travelled from all over the Riverina to participate in running races, high jump, long jump, shot putt, novelty events and relays. A few highlights from the day included Rebekah coming 1st in high jump and shot putt. Jahkobi came 1st in the 200m and 3rd in the 400m. Jason came 2nd in the 200m.

All students showed great sportsmanship throughout the day.













## TAS

This year in Engineering we had the privilege of having access to the schools new laser cutter. The laser cutter allows us to take 2D designs and cut them out of sheets of material, at very fast speeds. This new dynamic in the classroom allowed us to design test and create more efficiently. Our class first had to design and create a renewable energy generator, students of our class would print different pieces of their generator such as clamps, gears, handles, and panels and in no time at all have their digital design right in front of them to test and improve upon. The laser cutter had a huge edge over the 3D printers in speed and it helped students see what their designs were up to in seconds to minutes rather than the 3D printer's hours.

Later in the term we used the laser cutter to cut out the pieces for a robotic arm for every student in the class to build and then program, and without the laser cutter that probably wouldn't have been possible. Making replacement parts was a breeze if anyone's robotic arm broke and even adapting and modifying the arm was simple with the laser cutter.

Moving forward having used and continuing to use the laser cutter, has shown us a lot about design and gives any student the chance to create accurate and intricate designs for personal or school use, allowing the quality of work to increase with students who choose to use the new laser cutter.

## Science

There is a lot of exciting things happening in the Kooringal High School Science faculty during term 4. Firstly we have had 2 university students visit our faculty during the term to undertake practicum teaching as a part of their degree. Beginning at the start of term 4, we had Miss Ebony Williams undertaking her final placement at the school. Miss Williams taught multiple junior Science classes and Biology and was with us for 4 weeks. Currently, we have Mr Tim Blackburn undertaking his 2nd last placement, teaching multiple junior Science classes and Physics and will be with us until the end of week 8. Both of these student teachers have made great contributions to our faculty and will have prosperous careers in Science teaching.

The Science faculty has also purchased some new and exciting equipment which will allow us to examine a number of phenomenon. In particular, we have acquired a thermographic camera which can show the temperature of objects in photographs. This allows us to examine a number of phenomenon, including the rate of heat transfer, methods of heat transfer and individual temperatures of items in each photograph. We have also purchased some photographic gates that allow us to measure the speed of an object that moves between these gates, extremely accurately. These will allow us to analyse the motion of objects more accurately and predict the motion after objects have passed through.









Further work will take place during Activities week in week 10. In particular, Mrs Harrison's geological time scale of life on earth will continue its progress and come closer to completion. We are also planning on introducing a new mural project which will help students to learn about more about Chemistry.
