COVID-19 - important update

The senior executive have discussed a course of action for our school based upon the Secretary of the Department of Education's media release and the guidelines to schools which was given to Principals on Sunday night. All assemblies and excursions have been cancelled or postponed until further notice in line with the Department's advice. Our KHS Open Day on Wednesday will also be postponed.

The health and safety of our students and staff is paramount. If students or staff are unwell with respiratory illness, they should remain home until symptoms resolve and, where appropriate, seek advice from a medical practitioner.

From Monday, we have opened an additional section of the playground (the back oval) for our senior students during breaks which will lessen our congestion in other areas. We have also developed a staggered arrangement for students to collect their lunch from the canteen. We would appreciate if parents could assist by encouraging students who use the canteen to use the lunch ordering system which will help our canteen staff greatly.

Soap is available to all students in all bathrooms and will be checked daily. If students find the soap has run out or is missing, they should notify a staff member who will ensure it is rectified.

School sport has also been impacted but not cancelled with a change to some of the sports being on offer to minimise the student's interaction with the community as much as possible.

Whilst many of our staff use learning management systems such as Google Classroom already, all staff are also working towards ensuring that lessons will be available online in addition to face-to-face delivery for those students who are required to stay at home sick, particularly for our Year 11 and 12 students.

Even though many of our events at school such as assemblies have been cancelled, we can still look forward to being entertained and informed by KHS News during Mind Matters.

Finally, I would like to thank the students for their patience and compliance.

Students have been completing a variety of fieldwork activities throughout the school in preparation for an analysis of Lake Albert and will be asked to propose suitable sustainability practices.




11 Ancient History


