Principals Report

SASS Appreciation Week

This week is SASS Appreciation Week so I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of our wonderful SASS staff including our School Learning and Support Officers, our School Administration Officers, our General and Farm Assistants as well as our School Administration Manager. SASS staff are the engine rooms of all schools and we simply would not be able to operate without them.

COVID-19 Update

At the beginning of Week 5, we have had a COVID update. While many things remain the same, there are some changes for us to consider. One of the bigger changes is that if a student presents to school with flu-like symptoms we will require a parent or family member to collect that student. They can then only return after they have received a negative COVID test (which must be sighted by the school) and their symptoms have subsided. This also applies to staff so we may experience higher than usual rates of absence during this time. We wish to thank all of our parents and families for their support with this over the past two weeks.

Additionally, we are doing our best to keep our students in stage cohorts whilst at school. This means we have had some changes to our roll call organisation and we will be marking rolls in Period 1 for the time being. Although we will be moving ahead with our Athletics Carnival, measures have been put in place for the safety of all. Students will remain in stage cohorts and certain events, such as High Jump (where regular sanitising is difficult) have been cancelled or postponed to another day. Professional Learning for staff has also remained online only and our P&C Meetings will be conducted via Zoom for the moment.
