About the role

The Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning is establishing a Minister's Student Council for NSW public school students to provide input into Government education policy from February 2021. The council will be the peak body for interaction between NSW public school students, the NSW Department of Education, and the NSW Government. The first step is to establish a Student Steering Committee to shape the formation of the Minister's Student Council, including terms of reference, membership, and agenda.

Year 10 Work Experience Term 4

The opportunity for work experience will be available to Year 10 students in Term 4. However, there will now be extra steps to the organisation process and specific Covid safe requirements to be able to commence the placement. Students will still be expected to have the Student Placement Record and Teacher Notification completed and returned two weeks prior to the placement, as well as attend the Work Experience Preparation workshop prior to their first placement. In addition, there is now the requirement to complete a PPE and Health Checklist prior to the placement.

Please remember all construction related work experience placements require the completion of the WH&S White Card qualification (training must be done face to face). KHS will not be running any more White Card courses this year, but locally based organisations run the 1-day course regularly.

NB. While students are now able to discuss the possibility of work experience with employers, many still may not be in a position to be able to host students in the current climate.
