Wellbeing Hub

You may have noticed a few changes in the well-being hub. This term we welcomed Zimmerman Sarah as our School Psychologist to assist Paul Wetherbee. Sarah is available Monday, Tuesday and Friday whilst Paul works Wednesday to Friday. Parents who would like their child to access the counsellors, can ask for a referral form to be emailed to them from the relevant Year Advisor (we are working on a digital version). Students can self refer at any time.

Our Student Support Officers Josh and Kelsie have started small group programs with selected students that aim to develop skills in resilience, respect and anger management. Access to the wellbeing hub will be restricted throughout the HSC. Students in need of assistance are asked to report to the front office who will arrange an appointment for you.







Year 7 creating density columns



It may even be worth considering a quaint new Christmas custom: the four gift rule (note #4).




