Year 7 PDHPE

Students in Year 7 have been studying 'Sense of Self' as their first unit of work in the classroom. In practical lessons, students have been participating in Fitness Games and Athletics. The skills learnt from these units will enable the students to participate positively in the KHS Athletics carnival. We have a new Cardio room that students have also been using!



Year 8 PDHPE

Students in Year 8 have been studying the 'Move and Groove' unit in both theory and practical lessons. Students have been introduced to the Australian activity guidelines, the Fitness Components and how we can set positive and achievable goals. What is the Mathematics Growth Team (MGT)?

The Mathematics Growth Team, a part of the Best-in-Class Teaching Unit, amplifies the impact of expert mathematics teaching at targeted schools to:

- strengthen mathematics leaders and build a new generation of mathematics teachers across NSW public schools.
- support the use of evidence-based, best-practice assessment and teaching practices among mathematics educators.

Currently, the MGT consists of 15 school-based expert mathematics secondary teachers. Mr Pollard is the trainer based at Kooringal High School. Additionally, as part of the project – Ms Gooley has been successful in being appointed as an Embedded Instructional Leader to run and lead a targeted initiative within the Mathematics Faculty.

Both Mr Pollard Ms Gooley will be working with teachers and students to develop mathematics skills, engagement and knowledge at KHS.

As part of the work of the MGT, Eddie Woo (Leader of Mathematics Growth) will visit KHS on Tuesday 6th June to run a series of engaging student and staff workshops.

Aunty Isobel

This week, our school had a special visitor, Aunty Isobel, an Aboriginal elder who came to share her knowledge and culture with us. Aunty Isobel spoke about the history and traditions of her people, and we were fortunate to hear her personal stories of growing up on her ancestral land. It was a truly enlightening experience, and we learned so much about the importance of respecting and preserving Indigenous cultures. Aunty Isobel's visit reminded us of the ongoing journey towards reconciliation and the need for continued efforts to create a more inclusive and respectful society. We are grateful to have had this opportunity to learn from her and to deepen our understanding of the rich and diverse history of Australia

Aunty Isobel's visit was particularly relevant to the participating Year 12 Society and Culture class, who have been studying the role of elders in different cultures. During her visit, Aunty Isobel shared her perspectives on the importance of elders in Aboriginal communities and the traditional practices that have been passed down through generations. The students were able to engage in meaningful discussions and ask questions, which further enriched their understanding of the topic.

Aunty Isobel will be honoured on the 25th May with a plaque at Sturt Mall to recognise her efforts in educating all Australians about our path to reconciliation and all that she has achieved in her life.

Mummifying

Students in our Ancient History class recently had an opportunity to engage in a unique and exciting task - mummification! 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


achievements of our students who have participated in recent competitions and exhibitions, in particular Ben Murray having been selected from a state wide pool to be part of the Talent Development Project.
