

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As we reach the midpoint of Term 2, there are many positives to reflect upon from the first half of the term and so many things to look forward to in the second half. We began this term with some of our school leaders representing KHS at the ANZAC Day service in town and then followed this up with a very respectful ANZAC day service on school site. Having strong ties with our defence community, this is an extremely important event to acknowledge, and we are forever grateful to the service men and women who have both served our country and who are currently serving.

Our Term 2 Staff Development Day had an Aboriginal Education focus and staff spent the day on country beginning at the Wiradjuri Reserve with a tour around the Marrambidya Wetlands. We then made our way out to the Riverina Environmental Education Centre where we spent time engaging in activities which helped deepen our understanding of Aboriginal Culture and History. We are looking forward to seeing this learning having a positive impact for our students in classrooms.

Students have been busy completing assessments across a range of subjects and now staff are writing reports for students in Years 7 through to 11 to indicate progress and identify areas for future improvement. This semester, reports for Year 7 to 10 will be emailed to parents and carers to reduce our carbon footprint. However, we will have provision for hard copies to be made available to those who wish. More information will be conveyed home in the coming weeks for those who wish to take this option up. Our Year 11 and 12 reports will continue to be issued in hard copy format.

As always, Term 2 at KHS brings with it our annual school production and we are all very much looking forward to 'Murder on the Dance Floor'. Rehearsals are well under way and the stage is starting to take shape. The usual buzz that comes with this time of year is starting to ramp up and there is an air of anticipation around how it is all going to come together. 
Stage 4 materials unit - Students have been tye dying with Mrs Ritchie.

SCIENCE NEWS

It's been an exciting time in the world of science at KHS, and we are thrilled to share some incredible activities and opportunities that have been taking place at our school.

Science and Engineering Challenge

The Science and Engineering Challenge brought together our talented students to compete in a series of engaging activities designed to stimulate their problem-solving skills. From constructing earthquake-proof towers to Mars rovers, to efficient turbines and strong bridges, our students showcased their creativity and scientific knowledge. This event provided an invaluable platform for them to understand the practical applications of science and engineering in the real world.







CSU Visit for Biology and Investigating Science

A group of eager biology and science enthusiasts had the opportunity to visit CSU (Charles Sturt University) to explore the exciting fields of biology and ecology. The visit exposed them to cutting-edge research facilities and allowed them to interact with experts in the field. This experience sparked their curiosity and provided a glimpse into the vast possibilities within the scientific realm.



BioTech Futures Trip to Griffith

Our aspiring biotechnologists embarked on an eye-opening trip to the STEM facility at Murrumbidgee Regional High School, where they delved into the domain of biotechnology. Hosted by experts from the University of Sydney, through topics including nanotechnologies, gene editing techniques and 3D imaging our students witnessed the revolutionary advancements shaping the future of healthcare and agriculture. This immersive experience instilled a sense of wonder and excitement, inspiring them to pursue careers in this rapidly evolving field.



Year 7 Cell Model Task

Our Year 7 students demonstrated their creativity and scientific prowess through the creation of intricate cell models. By incorporating various materials and techniques, they brought cells to life in three-dimensional forms. This hands-on project enhanced their understanding of cellular structures, paving the way for further exploration in the realms of biology and life sciences.





Other activities going on in our labs have been unleashing the power of electricity with the Van der Graaf Generator, building fluid mosaic models of cell membranes to bring this intricate microscopic structures into a tangible space, and Depth Studies in Chemistry classes giving students the opportunity to explore projects of their own interest.


Food Technology


History

In History the IO class have started a unit on Ancient Greece. They have completed mapping activities, timelines and investigated the social structure of the Ancient Society.









At the start of Term 2 KHS had a ANZAC day service to commemorate the lives of Australians who died in war. The IO and MC Blue class completed silhouettes of soldiers, a Lighthorse soldier and nurses from several wars. The students used finger painting to emphasis poppies throughout the silhouette. The Stage 5 MC Class drew a detailed diagrams of a poppy and used red chalk on the background to emphasis their drawing. Lillian who is studying Visual Art and History for her HSC created a display for the ANZAC Day service utilising the artworks created by students in the Support Unit.



The Stage 4 MC class have been working on their research and report writing skills by selecting a well known Historical figure and they have now begun their study into The Middle Ages. The Stage 5 class have been learning about Rights and Freedoms and the Declaration of Human Rights. The students have had to choose and visually represent one chosen Human Right, similar to a picture book we studied called We are all Free.





English

In English this term the IO class have been studying Stories from other cultures. They read the picture book the Peasant Prince by Li Cunxin. The picture book is based on the true story of Mao's Last Dancer. Students compared life in America to China and discussed the themes of poverty and hardship. Through the book students saw how hard work and determination can lead to wonderful opportunities.



The Stage 4 MC Class have been studying the novel Swashbuckler. While reading the novel students have been developing comprehension skills and working through concepts such as bullying, resilience and friendship. The Stage 5 class have been studying The Hunger Games. The students have been working on their analytical and comprehension skills while delving into the dystopian fiction genre.

In Year 7, students are offered vaccines for diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (dTpa) and human papillomavirus (HPV). In Year 10, students are offered the meningococcal ACWY vaccine.

This year the scheduled date for vaccines at our school are:


- · Year 7 Friday 9th June
